FROM CHAIRMAN'S DESK

Dear Children,

In recent weeks, during Q&A sessions with students in Grades 7 and 9, one concern surfaced repeatedly: confusion over the use of technology in education—specifically AI tools like ChatGPT and the role of social media in schoolwork. To help clarify these doubts, I wanted to share a few thoughts on how we should view these powerful tools.



What is AI, exactly? In its current form, AI is best understood as a highly advanced language processor. ChatGPT was trained on vast amounts of human-generated text—books, articles, and websites. While it may seem like a search engine, there is a fundamental difference: Google retrieves and displays existing information, while AI predicts and generates new text.

Using statistical models and algorithms (that means high level mathematics and computer code), AI analyses language patterns to construct a response. It organizes information into a readable format, but it does not 'understand' a subject the way a human does. It is calculating the next most likely word, not 'thinking.'

So why is relying too much on AI a problem—especially for school assignments? What can go wrong if we let AI do our thinking for us? Let's look at a few reasons:

First, AI can be wrong. AI systems sometimes produce answers that sound confident but are factually incorrect or misleading. They do not truly understand the subject or verify facts; they only predict what seems likely based on patterns in data. If you rely on AI blindly, you may end up submitting incorrect or poorly reasoned work without realising it.

Second, it weakens understanding. If AI writes your assignments, you miss the opportunity to struggle with ideas, make mistakes, and learn from them. Over time, this reduces your ability to think independently, explain concepts clearly, and apply knowledge in new situations.

Third, it creates problems during exams and assessments. AI will not be available in the exam hall. If you have relied on AI to complete your schoolwork, you may find yourself unprepared to answer questions on your own, even on topics you have "submitted" assignments on.

Finally, it undermines honesty and self-confidence. Submitting AI-generated work as your own raises ethical concerns and can erode trust between students and teachers. More importantly, it prevents you from developing confidence in your own abilities and ideas.

Used wisely, AI can support learning. Used carelessly, it can replace learning, which means you do not learn anything, and that is what makes over-reliance on AI a serious problem.

Therefore, using AI as a Partner, can be beneficial. Using it as a Proxy i.e. a substitute for your thinking, can be harmful.

How can we use AI as an assistant rather than a replacement for our own intelligence? In my next communication to you I will suggest some tips and pointers.

7 July, 1999

Anti-Bullying Campaign: Building a Culture of Kindness and Respect.

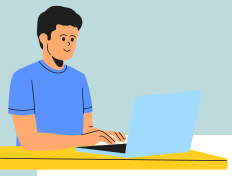

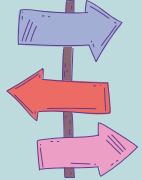

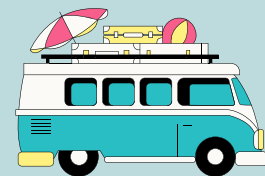

Field Trip Fun: A Day of Wonder at the Aquarium and Lalbagh

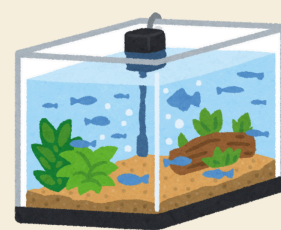
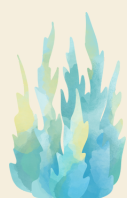
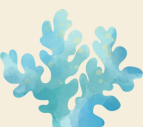

Dr. Narinder Singh Kapany (October 31, 1926 – December 4, 2020), also known as “Father of fiber optics”, hailing from Moga, Punjab, transfigured global communication by innovating and pioneering fiber optic technology in the 1950s. Despite a professor declaring “light cannot bend,” this Indian physicist refuted and proved otherwise, transmitting images through glass fibers. His invention became one of the revolutionary pillars of modern internet, telecommunications, and medical endoscopy.

An Indian invented the technology connecting the world, yet most Indians don't know his name. True legacy isn't fame—it's impact. Every video call we make honors Kapany's stubborn vision.

A serial entrepreneur with over 100 patents to his name, Kapany launched companies like Optics Technology and Kaptron while pouring his heart into preserving Sikh culture and art. In 2021, after his passing, India honored him with the “Padma Vibhushan”, the country's second-highest civilian award. The memoir of the man who Bent Light is a wonderful account of a radiant and humble visionary who saw the light and bent it to change the world.

I recall a moment in class when my teacher asked me to define the word Valor. I said it means being brave in difficult situations. 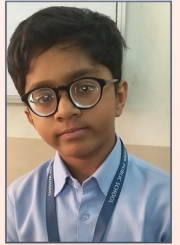

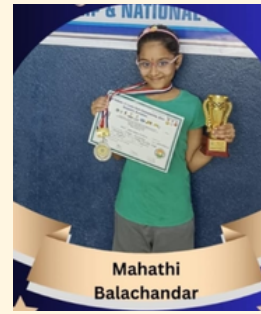

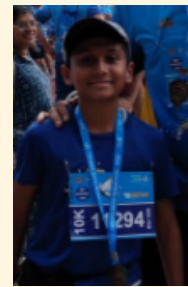
Shining Stars

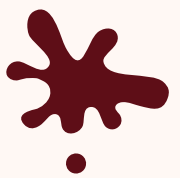

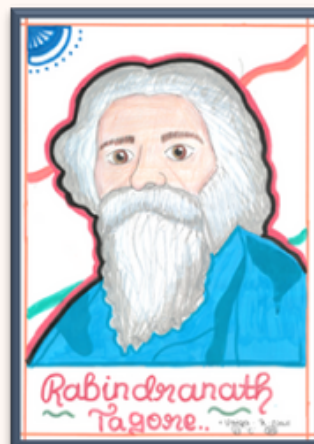
