Environmental Sustainability



“Life is not about the steps you have taken but the footprints you have left behind”.....so its upto us -HUMANS, to protect and sustain the four fundamental elements of the environment namely the Lithosphere(i.e the rocks and soil), the Atmosphere(i.e the air), the Hydrosphere(i.e the water) and the Biosphere(i.e the biological elements).

It is a known fact that human activities are the major cause of environmental degradation because most of the activities humans do harm the environment in some way. It is also a fact that only we humans can do what it takes to ensure environmental sustainability. Waste -to- Energy Recycling – a process of generating energy in the form of electricity and / heat from the primary treatment of waste or processing waste into a fuel source.

Water treatment Plants – frees scarce fresh water resources for other uses or preservation. Also the by-products of waste water treatment can become valuable for agriculture and energy generation thus making it sustainable.

Wind Turbines – can be installed in open fields, forests and even offshore without damaging the environment and thus helps in sustainable development as it generates large MW of energy.

Thus with awareness about all these initiatives that are in place to ensure environmental sustainability, it’s now our turn to ensure we protect the environment and preserve it for our future generations. Remember , “ Don’t Just Think, You Have To Take Action”.

Early childhood is the essential phase of life. To meet the prerequisites of early learning, the school organizes activities for the students of classes Pre-School and Pre-primary keeping in mind their age group, tenderness and interests. In pre-primary at school, we engage in various kinds of activities. These activities help children develop their skills and promote growth. During the activities, children learn something new, which aids in their growth and development while also enhancing their thinking power. Our activities are not limited to the classrooms; we also engage them in outdoor activities.

Innovative preschool learning approaches often involve hands-on activities, creative play, and nature-based education. Students participate in various activities during the settling period, such as playing with sand, play dough, water, and paint, which enhance their motor skills. They also engage in problem-solving activities, like arranging popsicles, and STEM activities, such as fishing, pattern matching, sorting, and stringing beads. Brain gym activities are conducted to coordinate the right and left brain to work together.

To reinforce colours, we celebrate days dedicated to specific colours like red, green, black, and white. On these days, students come dressed in the colour of the day, and fun activities follow. Science experiments are conducted to make them aware of temperature, taste (sweet and sour), and cleanliness. Students also engage in activities like hugging trees and sorting to improve their concentration and focus, while also fostering a love for nature.

To foster collaboration between parents, school management, and students for their educational future, we organize events for parent. Additionally, students are taken on short and informative field trips to understand the importance of community helpers in our lives. These trips aim to enhance visual learning and provide insights into the work of our community helpers.

We also conduct activities focused on cleanliness and hygiene. During these activities, children learn to segregate wet waste from dry waste and learn how to keep their surroundings clean. Furthermore, we organize a clay modeling competition, where children create healthy and unhealthy food items using clay. This activity aims to develop their fine motor skills, encourage creativity, boost concentration and patience, teach them the importance of nutritious food and maintaining good eating habits.

Let us strive for excellence and make the best use of education in fostering a positive impact on the world.

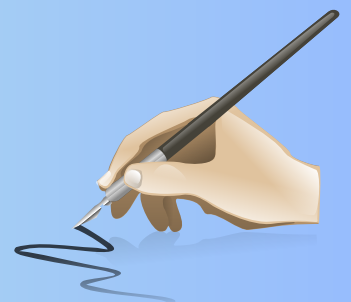

TEACHER'S MESSAGE

The Environment: Our Shared Responsibility



The environment encompasses the natural world and its intricate web of ecosystems, resources, and living organisms. It provides the foundation for life as we know it and influences everything from the air we breathe to the water we drink. As humanity continues to thrive, the health of the environment becomes increasingly crucial for our well-being and the well-being of future generations.

Plastic pollution has emerged as a significant environmental challenge, with its detrimental effects on ecosystems, wildlife, and human health becoming increasingly evident. Addressing this issue requires a combination of individual actions, governmental policies, technological advancements, and corporate responsibility.

Let's beat plastic pollution.

In the past 50-odd years, the world has learnt, to its horror, the problems of long-lasting and non-destructive substances, once considered wonder creations. Take DDT, which had such a long residence time in the environment that it led to accumulation of the pesticide in the eggs of birds and in the blood of humans. Or take chlorofluorocarbons (CFC), a non-destructive chemical, which literally burnt a hole in the stratospheric ozone layer. Worse still is carbon dioxide, emitted from the burning of fossil fuels, whose residence time is anywhere between 150 and 200 years in the atmosphere – and this stock of emissions is resulting in catastrophic climate change.

Plastic is another one of our wonder substances—an all-pervading essential in our lives that is used for almost everything, from piping water to packing milk to chips. It is this very characteristic of plastic that has become a bane of our environment. The waste of plastic has become that sign of the Anthropocene. Worse, massive quantities of plastic litter pollutes oceans and also enters the food chain through fish. In India, the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has two recent regulations for managing plastic waste. It has notified a ban on 19 items identified as “single-use plastic”. There are huge challenges and this is where we must work. First, we must get out of this usage of “single-use” plastic.

The fact is most plastic usage, particularly for packaging, is single-use. We pack and then use and throw. Second, we need to focus on the waste warriors. We must understand that if we are able to manage any plastic waste, it is because of the millions of people working in the informal sector who manage to make value out of our refuse.

Here are some key solutions to combat plastic pollution:

1. Reduction of Single-Use Plastics
2. Improved Waste Management
3. Recycling and Circular Economy
4. Innovation in Packaging
5. Ocean Cleanup Initiatives
6. Education and Awareness
7. Industry Responsibility
8. Government Policies and Regulations
9. International Cooperation
10. Consumer Choices

In conclusion, tackling plastic pollution demands a multifaceted approach involving various stakeholders. From policy changes and technological innovation to individual behavior shifts, the solutions to plastic pollution are interconnected and require a concerted effort to create a more sustainable future.

पर्यावरण है हम सब की जान, इसलिए रखो इसका ध्यान
वृक्ष है इस पर्यावरण के आभूषण, इनसे होता दूर प्रदूषण
बच्चों को भी दे यह शिक्षा, पर्यावरण की कैसे करें रक्षा!

मानव भी अजीब है, जो पहले पर्यावरण को नुकसान पहुँचाता है फिर पर्यावरण संरक्षण के लिए योजनाएँ बनाता है ! पर्यावरण की सुरक्षा और संरक्षण हेतु पूरे विश्व में 5 जून को 'विश्व पर्यावरण दिवस' मनाया जाता है। वर्ष 1972 में पर्यावरण के प्रति वैश्विक स्तर पर राजनीतिक और सामाजिक जागृति लाने हेतु इस दिवस को मनाने की घोषणा संयुक्त राष्ट्र ने की थी। इसे 5 जून से 16 जून तक संयुक्त राष्ट्र महासभा द्वारा आयोजित विश्व पर्यावरण सम्मेलन में चर्चा के बाद शुरू किया गया था। 5 जून 1973 को पहला विश्व पर्यावरण दिवस मनाया गया। तभी से ही यह समुद्री प्रदूषण, अधिक जनसंख्या, ग्लोबल वार्मिंग, और वन्यजीव अपराध जैसे पर्यावरणीय मुद्दों पर जागरूकता बढ़ाने का एक मंच रहा है।

पर्यावरण ने हमें सब कुछ दिया है। इसे सहेजकर रखना हम सभी की नैतिक जिम्मेदारी है। प्रकृति के द्वारा प्रदत्त पर्यावरण के विरुद्ध कार्य करने की वजह से पर्यावरण को नुकसान हुआ है। इसलिए हमें एकजुट होकर पर्यावरण के सुधार के लिए प्रयास करने चाहिए। जैसा कि हम सभी जानते हैं, परिवर्तन घर से शुरू होता है। माता-पिता के उचित मार्गदर्शन से बच्चे कई पर्यावरण अनुकूल आदतें सीख सकते हैं। इनमें शामिल है जब वे कमरे से बाहर निकलें तो लाइट बंद कर देना, कचरे को कम करना, स्कूलों और घर में पानी बचाना, स्कूलों और आस-पड़ोस में पेड़ लगाना और उनका पालन-पोषण करना आदि। बच्चों को बताएं कि कचरे को अलग-अलग कैसे करें और उसका निपटान कैसे करें। उन्हें यह भी सिखाएं कि कौन-सी सामग्रियां पुनः प्रयोज्य (Reusable) योग्य हैं और उनके उपयोग को प्रोत्साहित करें। विद्यालय द्वारा छात्रों के लिए पर्यावरण संरक्षण संबंधी नारे और चित्र लिखकर प्रदर्शित करना, वृक्षारोपण कार्यक्रम, वन महोत्सव कार्यक्रम आदि आयोजित करना चाहिए।

संयुक्त राष्ट्र द्वारा हर साल विश्व पर्यावरण दिवस के लिए विशेष थीम की घोषणा की जाती है। इस साल के लिए थीम है - 'प्लास्टिक प्रदूषण का समाधान'। अतः हम सब यह संकल्प करते हैं कि प्लास्टिक उपयोग को बंद करें और इसके बजाय पेपर बैग या कपड़े के बैग का उपयोग करें एवं प्लास्टिक निर्माण करने के स्रोत पर भी नियंत्रण हो।

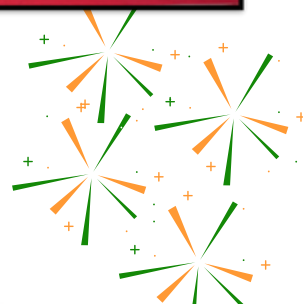


Tirangaa- Paribhraman; A journey across India

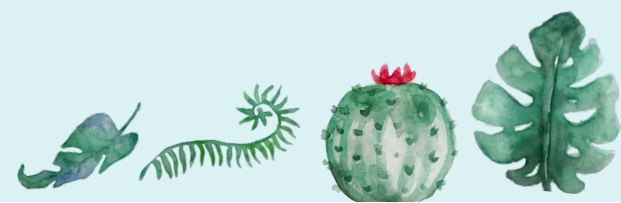

It is also when we form a deep connection with a person where we feel seen and loved for who we are. When we are surrounded by these people in our lives we feel pride and joy in our lives.

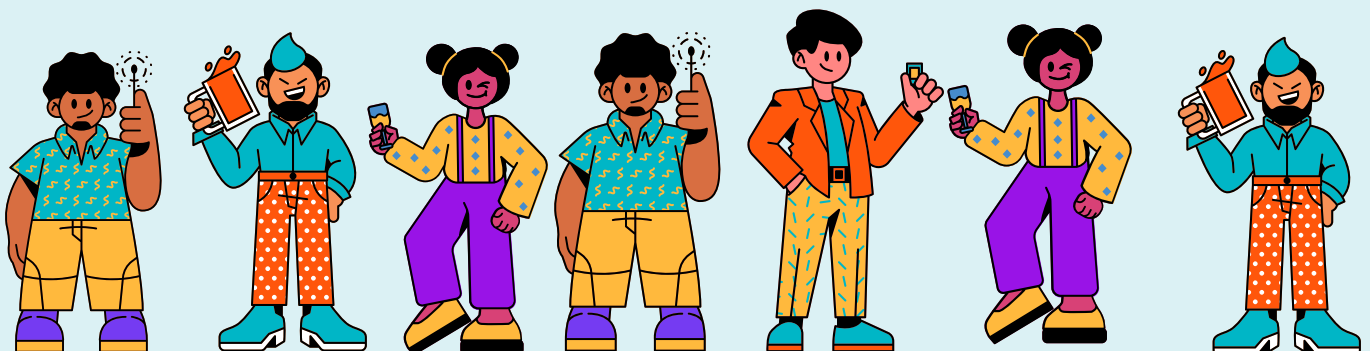

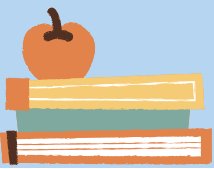
“Behind every child who believes in themselves was a teacher who believed in them first.”
