Safety First, Care Always!

At Shishya BEML Public School, student well-being is at the heart of every initiative. Preparedness and protection are emphasized under the Health, Safety & Child Protection (HSCP) framework and CBSE's School Safety mandate. Through awareness sessions and safety drills, the school promotes a secure, responsible, and caring environment for all.

POCSO Awareness Session

As part of HSCP initiatives and CBSE's mandatory safety measures, a POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) awareness session was conducted for students and staff. The programme sensitized participants on child rights, personal safety, and the legal framework, while encouraging openness and dialogue. It reinforced the school's commitment to safeguarding children and ensuring a safe, supportive atmosphere for every learner.

Fire Evacuation Drill

The school conducted a Fire Evacuation Drill on 29th August 2025 under the HSCP initiative, in alignment with CBSE's School Safety mandate. The entire school was successfully evacuated within 4 minutes and 49 seconds, following prescribed safety procedures, with teachers and the Student Council ensuring accurate headcounts and smooth movement across the campus. After the drill, Mr. Prasans from Sameeksha Enterprises conducted a Fire Safety Training session for the Student Council, providing hands-on guidance on handling fire extinguishers and their proper usage during emergencies. The exercise underscored the importance of alertness, discipline, and teamwork, while strengthening preparedness and confidence among students and staff, and reaffirming the school's ongoing commitment to safety awareness.

The rendition of the National Anthem brought the ceremony to a proud close, reflecting Shishya BEML Public School's dedication to bringing change through leadership, integrity, and service.










Independence Day
